**Additions & Clarifications to RFP/Bid**

<b>Question #1:</b>	Please clarify whether the ADA Transition Plan under this project shall cover only McHenry County right-of-way and not properties and buildings.
<b>Response #1:</b>	<b>McHenry County Roadway ROW only.</b>
<b>Question #2:</b>	Also, if properties and buildings are to be covered under the ADA Transition Plan, please clarify whether all McHenry County owned properties and buildings or just those for the Division of Transportation are to be covered.
<b>Response #2:</b>	<b>McHenry County Roadway ROW only.</b>
<b>Question #3:</b>	Development of an ADA Transition Plans generally requires self-evaluations to identify ADA barriers for all covered right-of-way, buildings, and properties. The effort to perform self-evaluations for all of McHenry County would be significant and probably beyond the anticipated project budget. Is performance of self-evaluations included in the selected engineering firm's scope of service or will these be performed under a separate agreement or by others?
<b>Response #3:</b>	<b>Evaluations are included in the scope.</b>

<p><b>Question #4:</b></p>	<p>I have one question regarding RFQ# 18-58. Throughout the RFQ, it requests services from an engineer.
