SUMMARY

The Carpenter maintains, repairs, remodels and constructs buildings, equipment and other facilities. Utilizes professional skills and knowledge to complete various assignments involving wood construction, concrete work, and plumbing. Builds and repairs wood forms, frames, shelves, cabinets, windows, doors and floors, concrete structures and plaster surfaces. Performs demolition, renovation and preventive maintenance on mechanical facilities, structures and buildings. Operates all equipment found in carpenter shop, including saws, sanders, drills, planers, and power hand tools. Performs heavy lifting tasks up to 75 pounds. Drives a motorized vehicle to travel to different locations. Performs tasks that will require walking, bending, stooping, standing, kneeling, climbing, reaching and sitting.

EXPERIENCE

Trade school or apprenticeship and two years of work experience as a carpenter, or commensurate training and experience; some supervisory experience preferred. Working knowledge of methods, practices, tools and materials used in carpentry and related trades; ability to maintain assigned tools and equipment.
