SUMMARY

The Lifeguard Team Leader provides for the safety of the public according to American Red Cross and site-specific lifesaving standards. Acts as a resource to patrons and lifeguards in the instruction of proper water safety, practicing sound public relations and customer service skills. Acts as emergency response team member, employing prescribed methods of identifying and reacting to potential or actual emergency situations. Serves as a mentor for lifeguards by running skills drills and mock rescues. Helps the Visitor Services Manager in lifeguard technique review, including scanning, transitions and response times. Directs lifeguarding procedures and guard station rotation in the absence of the Visitor Services Manager. Performs heavy lifting tasks up to 50 pounds. Performs tasks that will require walking, bending, jumping, swimming, stooping, standing, kneeling, climbing, reaching and sitting.

EXPERIENCE

One year Independence Grove Lifeguard experience. Exhibit strong swimming skills by passing a swim test, which includes the ability to complete a 50-yard swim in less than 40 seconds, and a 150-yard swim in less than three minutes. Upon employment, must successfully complete and obtain certification in the following: American Red Cross Advanced Lifesaving, CPR for the Professional Rescuer, First Aid, and Open Water Lifesaving. Candidates must pass a minimum standard of visual acuity test with or without corrective lenses prior to active duty.
